

H-2A Processing Crisis Talking Points

Congressional Easter Recess Period Senate Recess: March 19th through April 4th House of Representatives Recess: March 24th through April 11th

- I am [currently experiencing/hearing from folks who are helping me with labor that there currently are] H-2A processing delays of 2-3 weeks.
 - These delays are happening within the Department of Labor (DOL).
 - The bottleneck being created by DOL is causing further backlog at the Department of Homeland Security's Citizenship and Immigration Services (CIS).
- It is unclear what the precise issue is, but it appears that the DOL processing delays and computer issues might be connected to the H-2B problems experienced earlier this year, which may be cascading and impacting the processing of H-2A applications. As the H-2A applications are finally processed by DOL, they are dumped on CIS, resulting in delays there, as well.
- While we can't figure out exactly what the agencies need to resolve these H-2A processing issues, we need you [the Representative] to engage with both agencies and press for solutions to avert a pending crisis of delayed H-2A applications.
 - Our labor force is already perilously tight. Without additional H-2A workers, we will be in an untenable situation as we won't have the labor we need to harvest our crops.
 - What do these agencies need? Do they need some type of emergency funding? Do they need to spend money to authorize overtime for staffing/personnel to process the backlog? Whatever the solution(s) might be, these agencies need to figure it out and IMPLEMENT IT NOW.
- While chronic delays in the processing of H-2B workers may mean having a gardener show up a
 month late, this is only a minor inconvenience. Having an H-2A worker show up a month late
 means crops are left to rot in the fields, which causes significant economic damage to the
 farmer and impacts our ability to produce a stable domestic food supply, which is a national
 priority.
- Delays to date have involved hundreds of workers. But if these issues continue, we will be talking about tens of thousands of H-2A workers being delayed by early May. This will devastate the agricultural employers that rely on the H-2A program for part of all of their workforce [including my own].
- You [the Representative] need to lean on the DOL and CIS RIGHT to do whatever they need to do to solve this problem NOW, or else we are talking about an unmitigated disaster for [my business/the fresh produce industry].
