Nowell also has an active appellate practice, including successfully arguing before the U.S. Supreme Court in *Dart Cherokee Basin Operating Company v. Owens*, No. 13-719 (decided December 15, 2014). The Supreme Court victory prompted *Law360* to name him to its list of "Legal Lions" for the week of December 15, 2014.

He is the past chair of the State Bar of Georgia's Agriculture Law Section and has served on the advisory board of the National Agricultural Law Center at the University of Arkansas Law School. Nowell is a frequent speaker across the country on agricultural law issues. Before joining the firm, he served two years as a federal court law clerk to the Honorable Willis B. Hunt, Jr., U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Georgia.

Representative Experience

- Successfully petitioned the U.S. Supreme Court in *Dart Cherokee Basin Operating Co., LLC v. Owens*, No. 13-719, and then argued the case and convinced the Court to rule in clients' favor on the merits. The Court clarified that a defendant seeking removal to federal court need not include evidence of federal jurisdiction in its notice of removal; allegations of federal jurisdiction suffice. The Court also rejected the so-called "presumption" against removing cases to federal court under the Class Action Fairness Act.
 - Representing a major agricultural lender in peanut-related litigation in a Georgia superior court.
 - Counsel to a group of Vidalia onion producers in appellate litigation in the Georgia Court of Appeals.
